Late Work/ Missing Assignments	Late work will be addressed through natural consequences. For example missing lunch recess or coming in early to finish the assignment. Retests	Tests may be redone within one week of the test grade being posted. The final grade will be an average of the retest and original test. Daily work can not be retaken.	Tests may be redone within one week of the test grade being posted. The retest grade will replace the original test. Study Island will be assigned each week. It can be retaken within the week for a cumulative grade. Daily work can not be retaken.	At the teacher's discretion, students may redo assessments or assignments once. Students may receive half credit by completing corrections as per the teacher's discretion and instructions.

Homework		Homework will be assigned per teacher. Any classroom work not completed by the end of the school day may be sent home to be completed. Students are expected to read 20 minutes and practice math facts each night.	Any class work not completed in class or due to absences should be considered homework.
